## はじめに

このたびは弊社のロボットシステムをお求めいただきましてありがとうございます。

本マニュアルは、ティーチペンダント TP5100 について、既存の TP1000 の取扱説明書 SM-A20049 操作マニュアルを保有されていることを前提に、TP1000 と操作・表示が異なる部分のみ記載しています。操作手順が同じものについては TP1000 の取扱説明書 SM-A20049 操作マニュアルを参照してください。

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## 使用範囲について

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ワークの移動、整列といった搬送作業、部品の挿入、ねじ締めといった組立作業など、幅広い作業の自動化に適応することを意図して開発されました。

お客様におかれましても、これらの作業の自動化適応や自動化機器への組み込みを目的とした使用をお願い致します。

人に接触する作業（医療、介護に関する作業など）への適用、人の生命を維持する機器（生命維持装置、保育器など）への組み込み、人が搭乗する機器（車などの輸送機器、飛行機などの航空宇宙機器、ジェットコースターなどの遊戯機器）への組み込み、人命や人体を保護する機器（安全装置など）への組み込みなどは、意図しておりません。

高い熱量を制御することを目的とした機器（原子力制御機器、燃焼炉制御機器など）への組み込みなどは、意図しておりません。

故障や誤作動により、直接人の生命を脅かし、人体に危害を及ぼす恐れのある作業への適用や機器への組み込みには、本製品の使用を禁じます。使用された場合、お客様の責任で保証されることとなります。

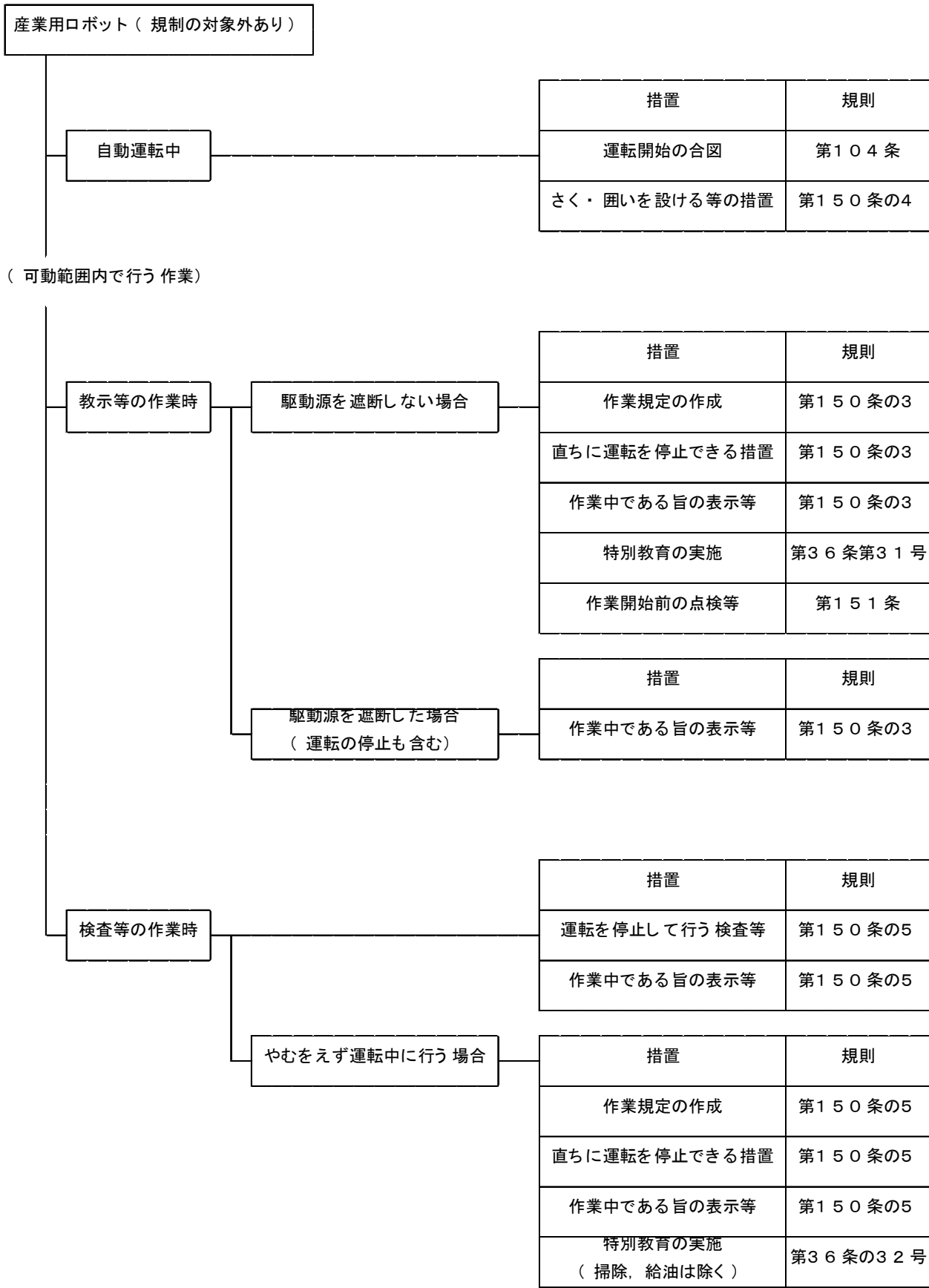

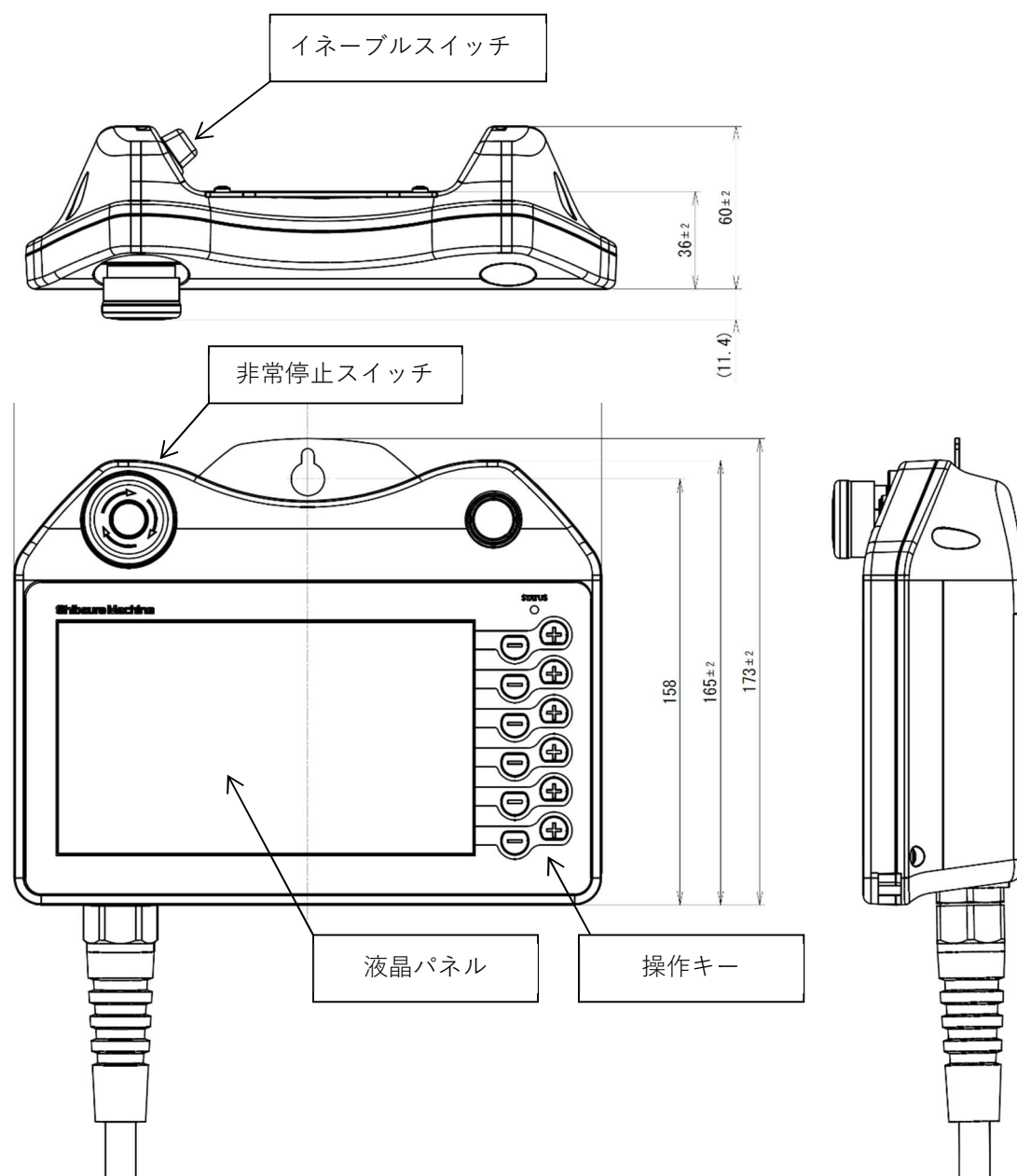

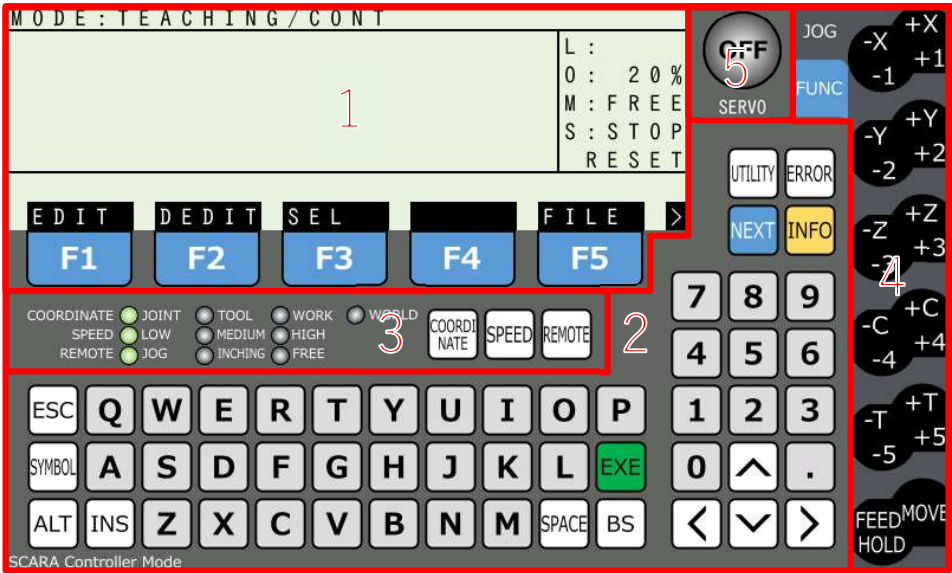

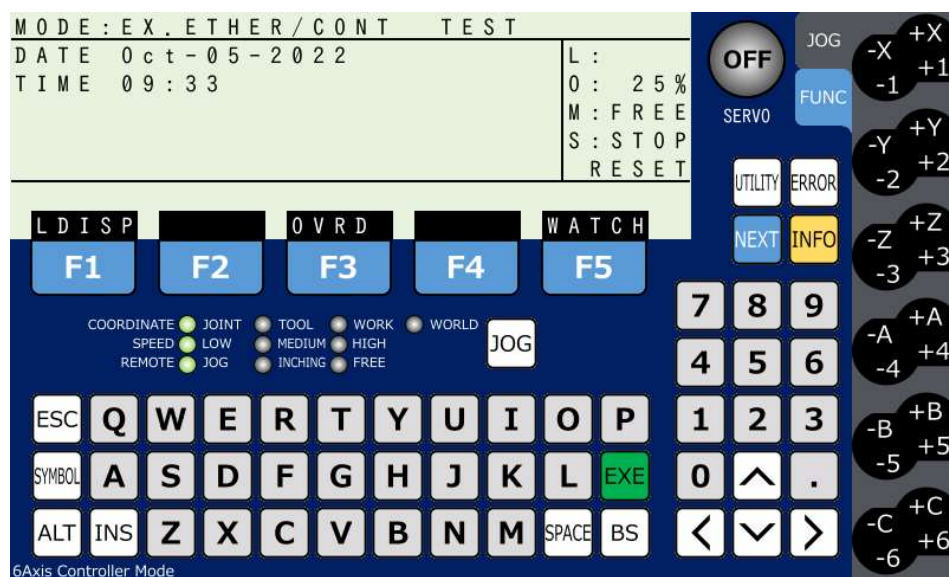

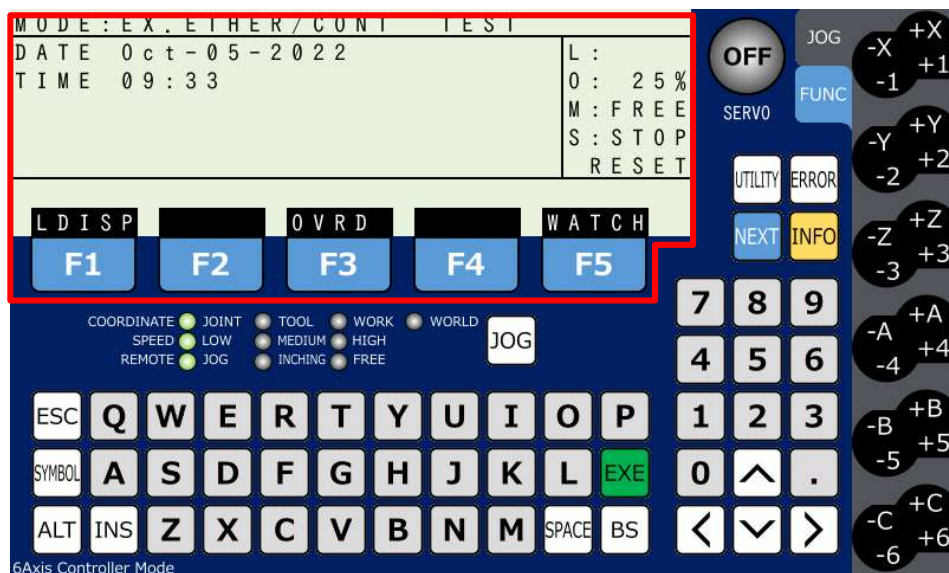

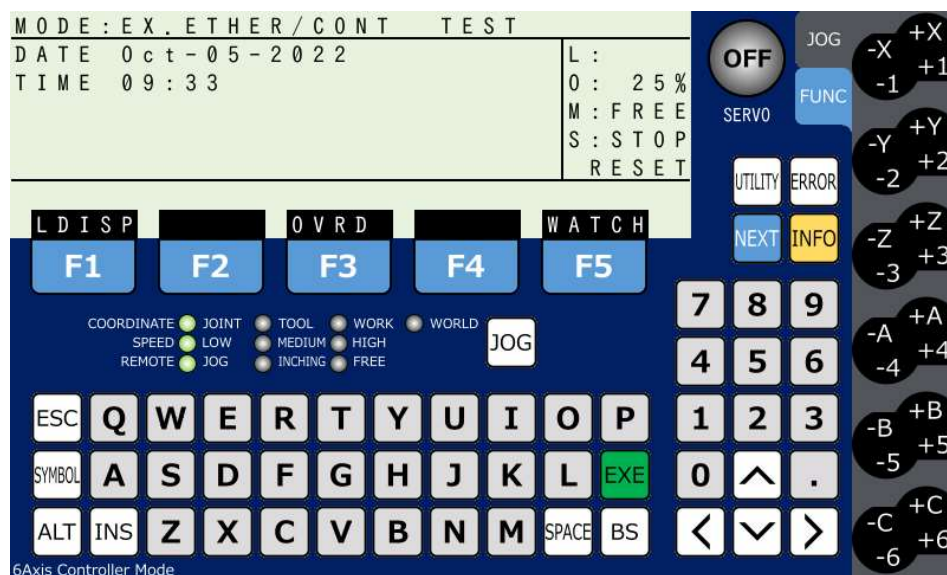

## 2.2 スクリーンセーバーについて

TP5100 には画面の焼き付き防止、バックライトの長寿命化のためにスクリーンセーバー機能があります。120 秒間操作しなかった場合、スクリーンセーバーが起動します。さらに一定時間経過後、バックライトが消灯します。

操作を行うとバックライトが点灯し、スクリーンセーバーが解除されます

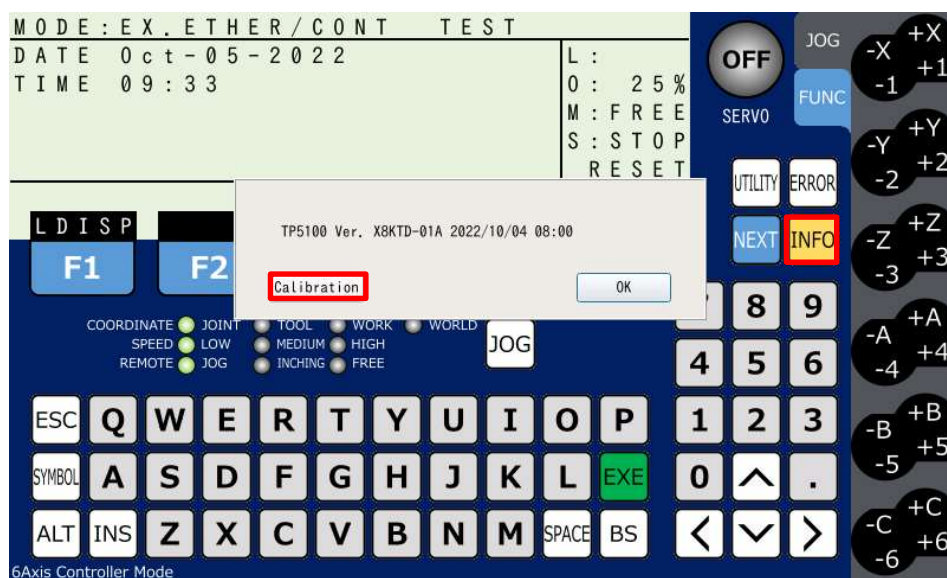

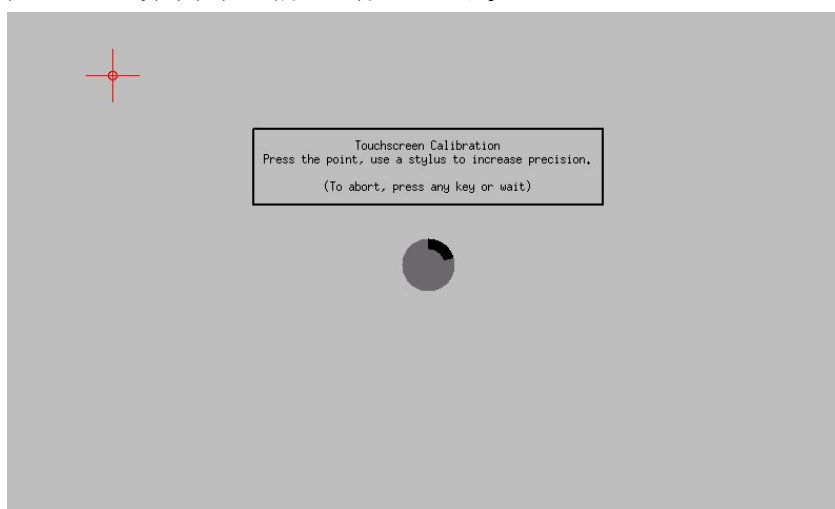
